


Immigrant Population


- Immigrant population in Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry decreased from 7.3% in 2006 to 6.5% in 2016.
- In 2016, the percentage of immigrant population in Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry was 6.5%, compared to 19.7% in the Ottawa-Gatineau CMA, 29.1% in Ontario and 21.9% in Canada.
- Majority of the immigrant population is located South Glengarry, corresponding to 7.4% of the total immigrant population of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry followed by 7.1% in Cornwall.
- From 2011 to 2016, immigrant population decreased by 485 persons in the 25 to 64 age group whereas the 65 years and older age group saw an increase of 260 persons.
- 56.4% of the total immigrant population were born in Europe.









Generation Status

In 2016, 90,975 persons or 82.1% were third generation or more (born in Canada with both parents born in Canada) compared to 60.8% in Ottawa-Gatineau CMA, 45.8% in Ontario and 58.4% in Canada.




Visible Minority Population

- In 2016, 3.5% of the population in Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry belonged to a visible minority group, compared to 21.6% in Ottawa-Gatineau CMA, 29.3% in Ontario and 22.3% in Canada.
- The Visible minority population in South Glengarry increased from 7% in 2011 to 7.4% in 2016.

Ethnic and Cultural Origins of the Population

- 67.2% of the population in Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry have European Origins compared to 59.4% in Ottawa-Gatineau CMA, 61.6% in Ontario and 57.1% in Canada.
- 50.5% of the population in Stormont, Dundas have Other North American Origins while 7.3% had North American Aboriginal Origins.
