

Quick Facts

- Languages other than English and French are becoming more common in Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry. The proportion of the population who reported an "other" mother tongue (alone or with other languages) rose from 4.9% in 2011 to 5.0% in 2016. Similarly, 1.1% of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry reported speaking only an "other" language at home in 2016.
- The proportion of residents from Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry who report English and French as known languages has been declined from 2011 to 2016. In 2016, 38.2% of the population had English and French as known languages, compared with 38.7% in 2011.
- The community with the largest population of French speaking residents was North Glengarry (40.9% of the population), followed by South Glengarry (29.6% of the population) and North Stormont (27.7% of the population).
- The community with the largest population of immigrant languages was South Glengarry (5.6% of the population), followed by South Dundas (4.2% of the population) and North Dundas (4.1% of the population).
- In 2016, 91.6% of the population selected English as their primary language at home. Comparatively, 87.9% of Ontario's population selected English as their primary language at home and 70.2% of Canadians selected English as their primary language at home.
