# Province preparing to launch 'My Main Street' Grants

My Main street is a \$15 million investment to foster the stabilization and revitalization of main streets across southern Ontario. The program will offer streamlined direct-to-business supports and complementary programming for community projects that will encourage growth and economic prosperity. https://mymainstreet.ca/

## My Main Street: Business Sustainability Program

#### Apply for up to \$20,000 per business

Businesses located on main streets across Southern Ontario (including all of SDG Counties) that have demonstrated revenue growth and provide a business case on how the funding with strengthen their existing capacity and support their growth can apply for up to \$20,000 in funding. The My Main Street Program is operated by the Canadian Urban Institute and is financed by the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario. Funding will be made available to businesses that employ between 1 and 50 staff. The intake is expected to launch soon.

## Municipalities can apply for up to \$250,000 to revitalize their Main Streets

This program supports high-impact placemaking projects that seek to revitalize neighborhoods and reimagine public spaces including main streets, downtown strips and plazas as vibrant and inclusive places that work for everyone.

Funding will be allocated to provide non-repayable contributions up to \$250,000 to support community not-for-profit projects.

# Brush up on your grant writing with Community Funding 101

Local stakeholders will have a chance to learn about funding opportunities and gain valuable tips for writing grants during the Community Funding 101 workshop on Wednesday, February 21st at the Cornwall Civic Complex. opportunities while also helping our community members feel more confident and comfortable with the process of writing grants," said Kevin Lajoie, Tourism Officer. "The session will provide useful information for groups who may be exploring funding opportunities for events, programs and projects both in the near-term and the long-term."

# RT-09 Partnership Funding accepting applications for tourism grants

RTO 9's Partnership Fund initiative is designed to introduce new tourism products and build on existing tourism products that enhance the region's diversity of tourism attractions. Intake #1 Applications will be for projects beginning April 1, 2024 - September 6, 2024.

#### Important to note:

- Indigenous operators must be 51%+ Indigenous owned and controlled and in lieu of a CRA Business Number (BN), must be able to provide a Certificate of Indian Status Registry Number or a Métis Registry Number.
- A letter of support from your DMO/DMP is mandatory. SDG Tourism is the DMO for all businesses located within the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry. Contact Karina Belanger at kbelanger@sdgcounties.ca to learn more.
- All partner contributions must be made electronically via either EFT or e-transfer.
- There is one general application. Applications are submitted through an online form that can be re-accessed from the **same device**.

#### There are 3 categories to apply under:

- 1. New Events
- 2. Development of Indigenous Tourism Product
- 3. Signage

The opportunity to apply for partnership funding will close on March 3rd, 2024.

## SDG Counties Regional Incentives Program

The 2024 intake for the Regional Incentives Program officially launches on

Friday, January 5th,, 2024. **The intake closes on Thursday, February 29,** 2024 at noon. Only one intake is proposed for 2024. Any additional intakes will only occur if there are funds remaining following the initial intake.

#### The primary goals of the program are to:

- 1. Stimulate investment in tourism and in the agricultural sector by funding diverse, on-farm expansions and agri-tourism.
- 2. Encourage redevelopment and private sector investment in existing building stock within SDG Counties to support employment, reduce the number of vacant commercial, institutional and industrial buildings, and increase the assessment base.
- 3. Increase the amount of permanent roofed accommodations within SDG Counties to specifically accommodate for an increase in tourism establishments that cater to short-term accommodations.

The first public session for job seekers will run from 1 pm to 3 pm and the second session will run from 6 pm to 7 pm.


